Farmer's Market: Know your Farmer, Know your Food!

This summer, come on down to Library Park for the Tuesday Morning Market, presented Lake County Farmers' Finest.

New this season at the Tuesday Market:

- They will be accepting WIC Fruit & Vegetable checks, as well as EBT/CalFresh
- Dollar-for Dollar match – when you use your EBT benefits to purchase food at the Market (up to a daily limit per card).

Certified Farmers' Markets are an effort to reestablish the traditional link between farmers and consumers in California. Certified Farmers' Markets are "the real thing;" places where genuine farmers offer only agricultural products they grow themselves for direct sale to the public. By eliminating the middleman's additional costs and multiple product handling, both the farmers and the consumers benefit.

Buying in-season and as local as possible makes a huge difference on our carbon footprint when you consider the true costs that go along with moving large quantities of perishables over long distances.

Lake County Farmers' Finest mission is to:

- Educate and encourage Lake County farmers to grow for the market - thinking first about consumers, their tastes, convenience, and health.
- Awaken consumers to Lake County's superior food products and encourage their loyalty.

Successful business recruitment and retention requires that owners feel secure in their investment in a site, inventory, and employees. This business liaison officer will walk our business areas, meet owners and workers, make frequent contact, and be quickly available when necessary.

New Bike Pump Track Completed

A new bicycle pump track is now open to the public near the softball field, in what is known as the Phase II portion of the park.

The unpaved track is a series of dirt mounds, loops and jumps that is meant to be ridden without pedaling, but with the pumping motion of the rider's upper and lower body propelling the bike forward. It has proven popular with local bike groups and teams in the short time it has been opened. The project was made possible by the generous financial assistance provided by the **Lakeport Rotary Club**, and labor provided by the volunteers on the **Westside Community Park Committee**.

- JULY 3: 9:00 AM TO 10:00 PM
- JULY 4: 9:00 AM TO 11:00 PM

Places Designated for Discharge:

- ☀ City Parking Lot North of Fourth Street
- ☀ Any street within the incorporated area of Lakeport which does not violate section 5.30.180 B of the Municipal code.
- ☀ It is unlawful to discharge over or onto the property of another without permission, or within 10 Ft. of any residence or within 10 feet of any residence or dwelling used as a place of habitation.
