# AB109 REALIGNMENT

- **The Cornerstone of California's Solution to Reduce Overcrowding, Costs, and Recidivism**
- **Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. signed Assembly Bill (AB) 109: 2011**
- **Reduces the number of inmates in the state's 33 prisons to 137.5 percent**
- **By June 27, 2013, as ordered by the Three-Judge Court and affirmed by the U.S. Supreme Court**
- **Implementation of the 2011 Realignment Legislation began October 1, 2011**

**CDCR continues to have jurisdiction over all offenders who are on state parole prior to the implementation date of October 1, 2011**

**Prospectively, county-level supervision for offenders upon release from prison will include **current non-violent, current non-serious** and some sex offenders**

**County-level supervision will not include:**

- **Inmates paroled from life terms to include third-strike offenders;**
- **Inmates who's commitment offense is violent or serious High-risk sex offenders**
- **Mentally Disordered Offenders**
- **Offenders on parole prior to October 1, 2011.**

# **Post-Release (County-Level) Community Supervision (PRCS)**

**Realignment subjects released from county no longer on state parole**

**Monitored by local probation department**

**As of March 9, 2016 in Lakeport**

- **62 subjects on Felony probation**
- **8 subjects on Misd probation.**
- **13 subjects on PRCS**

**As of January 2016 in Lakeport**

- **23 subjects on state parole**

# **IMPACTS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AND COMMUNITY**

**Since 2011 through February 28, 2013:**

- **average jail population of 298 inmates**
- **83 of which were realignment prisoners**
- **as many as 101 realignment prisoners have come through the jail since 2011**
- **average population reached 330 inmates in custody at one time**
- **maximum bed space capacity of 286**

# **IMPACTS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AND COMMUNITY**

**March 1, 2013-December 31, 2013:**

- **average jail population of 307 inmates (includes home det)**
- **released a total of 423 early release inmates in the year.**
- **booked 59 realignment subjects**

# **IMPACTS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AND COMMUNITY**

**January 1, 2014-December 31, 2014**

- **average population of 335 inmates (includes home det)**
- **released a total of 501 early release inmates in the year**
- **booked 41 realignment subjects**

# **IMPACTS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AND COMMUNITY**

**Jan 1, 2015-Dec 31, 2015**

- **average population of 272 inmates (includes home det)**
- **released a total of 38 early release inmates in the year**
- **booked 41 realignment subjects**

**\*The significant drop in 2015 is relative to Proposition 47**

# **Reduction of Existing Penalties**

**This measure reduces certain nonserious and nonviolent property and drug offenses from wobblers or felonies to misdemeanors.**

**Specifically, the measure reduces the penalties for the following crimes:**

- **Grand Theft**
- **Shoplifting**
- **Receiving Stolen Property**
- **Writing Bad Checks**
- **Check Forgery**
- **Drug Possession**

## **Common crimes we investigate in Lakeport**

**Grand Theft: This measure would limit when theft of property of \$950 or less can be charged as grand theft. Specifically, such crimes would no longer be charged as grand theft solely because of the type of property involved.**

**Shoplifting: Under this measure, shoplifting property worth \$950 or less would always be a misdemeanor and could not be charged as burglary.**

**Drug Possession: possession for personal use of most illegal drugs (such as cocaine or heroin) is a misdemeanor, a wobbler, or a felony. Under this measure, such crimes would always be misdemeanors.**



## **GENERAL CALLS:**

### **JANUARY 1, 2010 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2012**

- ROUGHLY 20,000 CALLS FOR SERVICE
- AVERAGE RESPONSE TIME 9:43

### **JANUARY 1, 2013 THROUGH JANUARY 1, 2016:**

- ROUGHLY 22,736 CALLS FOR SERVICE
- AVERAGE RESPONSE TIME 11:14

## **PRIORITY CALLS:**

### **JANUARY 1, 2010 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2012**

- AVERAGE RESPONSE TIME 4:30

### **JANUARY 1, 2013 THROUGH JANUARY 1, 2016**

- AVERAGE RESPONSE TIME 4:49

# **UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING STATISTICS AND THEIR PROPER USE (UCR)**

- **FOUND ON FBI WEBSITE**
- **VOLUNTARY INFO SENT FROM POLICE AGENCY**
- **UCR REPORTS SERVE MANY PURPOSES**
  - PROVIDES DATA FOR BUDGET FORMULATION  
PLANNING AND RESOURCE ALLOCATION
  - PROVIDES AN ASSESSMENT FOR ADDRESSING  
CRIME PROBLEMS
  - MEDIA OUTLET AND CHAMBER OF COMMERCE  
MAY USE INFORMATION TO NOTIFY PUBLIC
  - CITY COUNCIL COULD USE DATA TO DRAFT  
ORDINANCES REGARDING CRIME ISSUES

# **WARNING!**

## **UCR DATA:**

- IS SOMETIMES USED TO COMPILE RANKINGS OF INDIVIDUAL JURISDICTIONS

## **THE INCOMPLETE ANALYSIS RESULTS IN:**

- MISLEADING PERCEPTIONS
- ADVERSELY AFFECTS ENTITIES AND THEIR RESIDENTS

## **THE FBI HAS:**

- POLICY AGAINST RANKING AGENCIES ON THE BASIS OF CRIME DATA ALONE

## **DESPITE REPEATED WARNINGS BY THE FBI:**

- SOME DATA USERS CONTINUE TO CHALLENGE AND MISSUNDERSTAND THIS POSITION

## **CITIES SHOULD NOT BE RANKED:**

- BASED ON THIS DATA ALONE
- RANKINGS IGNORE UNIQUENESS OF EACH CITY

**-RANKING AGENCIES BASED ON UCR DATA HAS SERIOUS IMPLICATIONS.**

**EXAMPLE: IF A USER WANTS TO MEASURE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF A POLICE AGENCY, THESE MEASUREMENTS AREN'T AVIALABLE. AS A SUBSTITUTE A USER MIGHT LIST UCR CLEARANCE RATES, RANK THEM BY AGENCY, AND ATTEMPT TO INFER THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THAT AGENCY. THIS IS FLAWED BECAUSE ALL OTHER MEASURES OF POLICE EFFECTIVENESS WERE IGNORED.**

- combines reverse 911 directories with a comprehensive database
- geographically-located phone numbers that do not require citizens to opt-in for emergency usage

## **IPAWS:**

- Integrated Public Alert & Warning System
- Provides for public alert system to those in a geographic location
- whether signed up to nixle or not
- when a qualified emergency is occurring

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




